Kiev – 2017 European Diving Championships – Facts & Figures

... **DATE:** From June 12-18, 2017 the Ukrainian capital will stage the 38th edition of the European Diving Championships. It is not just the first ever Aquatic Championship held in Ukraine, but, for the athletes, a “last rehearsal” for the 2017 World Championships in Budapest, Hungary in four-week time (July 14-30).

... **VENUE – SPECTATORS:** The Sports Center LIKO will serve as the venue for the 13 diving events. It was built in 2013 with the support of the main sponsor of the Ukrainian Diving Federation – the company "Liko-holding" – and offers a seating capacity of 500. The modern sports complex is also the basis of the national diving team and youth sports school “Triumph”. To achieve the maximum level of water filtration – regarding the highest international standards of water quality – the sports complex uses modern water treatment technology. The sports centre regularly hosts sports camps of the Ukrainian national team as well as national and international championships. In September 2013, the TV show "Splash" (Ukrainian version) was realised there. Founder of the Sports Center LIKO is Igor Lisov, member of the Executive Committee of the NOC of Ukraine and – since 1999 – President of the Ukrainian Diving Federation.

... **LEN:** The “Ligue Européenne de Natation” was founded on August 30, 1927 in Bologna (ITA) by 11 countries and their national swimming federations, one year after the first European Championships in Swimming, Diving and Water Polo had been held in Budapest. Today LEN has 52 member federations ranging from Albania to Ukraine.

... **HISTORY of EUROPEAN CHAMPIONSHIPS:** With five editions, **Hungary** is the “record holder” as organiser of European Championships. For the first time in 1926, the capital on the Danube River acted as the host to the inaugural championships (with men’s events): six in swimming, two in diving and the water polo tournament with Hungary as the winner. The second Budapest edition took place in 1958, then in 2006 and 2010 the Magyar capital was again host of the championships, with events in Swimming, Diving, Synchronised Swimming and Open Water Swimming. The latter took place at Balantofured (Lake Balaton). The most recent championships in Hungary were held in Debrecen 2012 in Swimming. Diving and Synchronised Swimming were organised separately in Eindhoven in the Netherlands, while Open Water Swimming were staged in Piombino, Italy. In addition, the city of Budapest also hosted the European Water Polo Championships in 2001 and 2014. In July 2017, Budapest will host the 17th FINA World Championships.

... **HOSTS:** The **Ukrainian Diving Federation**, founded in 1992, celebrates its 25th anniversary and hosts its first ever LEN European Championship. In Diving the Ukrainian hosts will obviously try to maintain their top position in Europe. At the last edition 2016 in London, Great Britain, they finished in third position in the medal table with eight medals (three gold – two silver – three bronze). Ukrainian divers altogether collected a total of 81 medals (21 gold – 22 silver – 38 bronze) at the European Diving Championships until 2016.



Kiev – 2017 European Diving Championships – Facts & Figures

... **PARTICIPANTS:** The Sport Center LIKO will open its doors to 124 divers. **23 LEN Member Federations** represent a high number of entries in 13 events, including the Mixed 3m Synchro and Mixed 10m Synchro events, which are on the schedule since 2016.

... **COMPETITION MODUS:** In individual events two entries per federation and per event may be submitted. For the synchronised events as well as the team event only one team per federation and per event may be submitted.

...**MEDALS:** In the history of European Diving Championships – from 1926 in Budapest until today – a total number of **753 medals** have been awarded so far to gold (251), silver (253) and bronze (250) medallists. Only in 2004 two silver medals (no bronze) were awarded in the Platform Synchro Men to Germany and Russia.

... **PRIZE MONEY:** LEN's budget for 2017 includes €1,100,000 in prize money for athletes, accommodation and travel assistance for the participating federations at the 2017 continental championships, including the Diving Europeans in Kiev and the European Short Course Swimming Championships in Copenhagen, Denmark in December.

LEN Première in Kiev, Ukraine World Championship rehearsal for Budapest

After the introduction of annual European Diving Championships, the federations of Italy and Germany both hosted the championships twice in those years when the events were organized separately. Turin welcomed the divers in 2009 and 2011, Rostock in 2013 and 2015. But now it's the turn of Ukraine's capital Kiev to carry out the 13 diving events. Apart from the European Masters Championships in 2011 in Ukraine – when the diving events were already organized in Kiev – it will be the first championships in the country that celebrated its independence on August 24, 1991.

At the same time, the championships this year are the last rehearsal for the European diving elite ahead of the World Championships that will be staged in Hungary's capital Budapest on July 14-30. With Germany, Russia and host Ukraine, three nations have entered divers for all 13 events in Kiev. A total of 23 nations out of the 52 LEN Member Federations will take part, one more than last year when the championships were held together with the swimming and synchronized swimming events in the Olympic Aquatic Centre in London.

Three of the 2016 winners will try to defend their respective titles in Kiev: local hero Illya Kvasha from Ukraine in the 1m springboard, Evgeny Kuznetsov (Russia) in the 3m springboard as well as Victor Minibaev and Nadezhda Bazhina (Russia) in the team event.

After the 2016 Olympic Games in Rio de Janeiro, a number of international top divers have ended their active careers. Perhaps above all Italy's Tania Cagnotto will be missed by many who, together with Francesca Dallapè earned eight consecutive titles in the 3m synchronised event. Tania is the most successful diver at European Diving Championships with 20 titles to her name since 2002 (with additional five silver and four bronze medals). She said goodbye to the sport at the national Italian diving championships in May in Turin. Shortly ahead of that her partner Francesca Dallapè gave birth to daughter Ludovica.

Germany's Sascha Klein and Patrick Hausding even claimed nine consecutive titles in the synchro platform event. While Hausding has entered the 1m and 3m springboard event, the synchronised 3m as well as the team event in Kiev, the active career of Sascha Klein is approaching to its end. Klein will compete with Hausding in the platform event at the World Championships in Budapest. With a total of 13 gold, eleven silver and three bronze medals to his name since the 2008 Europeans, Hausding is currently the most successful European Championship participant.

A short excursion into history reveals that diving events are part of the competition programme since the première of the European Aquatics Championships. At the very first edition in Budapest in 1926, only men competed in the 3m springboard and platform events. One year later in Bologna, women could enter the same events. The women's and men's synchronised events were included to the competition programme in Seville in 1997 while the team event celebrated its



official première in Eindhoven 2012. Last year in London, finally, the mixed platform synchro and mixed 3m synchro events were officially introduced.

Team Event

Russia will be represented by defending champions Victor Minibaev and Nadezhda Bazhina, who could well clinch the title for the fourth time in a row. Host Ukraine has entered Oleksandr Gorshkovozov – silver medal winner of London – and Valeriia Liulko as his new partner. Gorshkovozov's former partner Iuliia Prokopchuk as well as her teammate Olena Fedorova will miss the championships due to pregnancy. Matthew Lee (Great Britain), 2016 bronze medal winner, will compete with Lois Toulson, while Germany will be represented by experienced Patrick Hausding and Maria Kurjo, who claimed the silver medal in front of a home crowd in Rostock in 2015.

Mixed 3m Synchro

At the European première of this event in London last year, Great Britain's Thomas Daley and Grace Reid claimed the gold medal. As the Britons will not compete, the title favourites are Russia's Nadezhda Bazhina and Sergei Nazin. Bazhina claimed the bronze medal in London together with Nikita Shleikher. 2016 silver medal winner Maicol Verzotto (Italy) will compete with Elena Bertocchi (instead of Tania Cagnotto).

10m Platform Women

None of the 2016 medallists – Ukraine's 5-time title-holder Iuliia Prokopchuk and Great Britain's Tonia Couch and Georgia Ward – will join the show in Kiev. This is why Laura Marino (France) and Noemi Batki (Italy) will be in the limelight. They earned the silver (Marino) and bronze (Batki) medals in 2015. Both will have to fight against, among others, Yulia Timoshinina (Russia), who has yet to earn an international medal in an individual platform event. Further medal contenders are local hero Ganna Krasnoshlyk (Ukraine) as well as the Germans Mario Kurjo and Christina Wassen.

Synchronised 10m Platform Women

While Maria Kurjo and My Phan earned the title in May 2016, Germany will now be represented by Christina (18) and her sister Elena Wassen, 21 months to her younger sister – two divers who are still eligible to compete in junior events. In Kazan in November 2016, Elena Wassen took the podium's top spot in the platform event at the Junior World Championships. Instead of 2016 silver medal winner Ganna Krasnoshlyk and Vlada Tatsenko, host Ukraine has entered a new duo Valeriia Liulko and Soffiia Lyskun. Russia's Yulia Timoshinina, 2014 and 2015 winner together with Ekaterina Petukhova, has a new partner Valeriia Belova.

1m Springboard Men

It was in Eindhoven in 2008 that Illya Kvasha celebrated the first of his so far six titles in the 1m springboard event – the last came in London last year. Local hero and defending champion Kvasha is therefore one of the top favorites in this event. Apart from his compatriot Oleg Kolodyi, there are Giovanni Tocci of Italy and Austria's Constantin Blaha (2016 silver and bronze medal winners) who hope to have a word or two during Kvasha's parade. Further medal contenders are the 2014



European champion Patrick Hausding and Matthieu Rosset of France who claimed the gold medal in 2015.

Synchronised 10m Platform Men

Defending champion Sascha Klein will not compete in Kiev, so a new champion will be crowned in this event for the first time since 2008. Together with Patrick Hausding, Klein created a winning streak with a total of nine consecutive titles that will be hard to match in the future – whatever event we consider. Medal contenders are 2016 bronze medal winners Oleksandr Gorshkovozov and Maksym Dolgov of the Ukraine, Russia's Nikita Shleikher and Aleksandr Belevtsev as well as Belorussia's Vadim Kaptur, who took the silver medal in 2014 together with his partner Yauheni Karaliou. In Kiev, Kaptur will compete together with his new partner Artiom Barouski.

3m Springboard Women

Without Tania Cagnotto, who claimed the title in 2015 and 2016, or Nadezhda Bazhina, winner in 2014, Germany's Tina Punzel might have a chance to take her second title in this discipline after 2013. However, she will face tough challenge from Grace Reid, 2016 bronze medal winner, and Russia's Kristina Ilinykh, who took silver in 2015. Host Ukraine is pinning its hopes on Anna Pysmenska and Anastasiia Nedobiga.

Mixed 10m Platform Synchro

Ukraine's Maksym Dolgov and Iuliia Prokopshuk claimed the very first title in this event last year. This time round, Dolgov will compete together with Valeriia Liulko. Great Britain will be represented by Matthew Lee and his new partner Lois Toulson. Last year Lee and Georgia Ward took the silver medal. The 2016 bronze medal winner, Yulia Timoshinina of Russia, will be competing with Victor Minibaev instead of Nikita Shleikher.

3m Springboard Men

With defending champion Evgeny Kuznetsov (Russia), Matthieu Rosset (France, 2012 and 2015 European champion), Olympic bronze medallist Patrick Hausding (Germany, 2010, 2011 and 2014 European champion) and World runner-up Ilya Zakharov (Russia/2013) all European champions since 2010 have entered this event. And all of them have claimed either the silver or bronze medal, too. Another medal candidate, however, is Illya Kvasha, the undisputed number one in diving in Ukraine. Last year in London Kvasha won the bronze medal as well as silver in 2008 and 2009 in this event.

Synchronised 3m Men

For Great Britain the young duo Frederick Woodward-James Heatly will replace European and Olympic champions Jack Laughler and Christopher Mears. Russia has entered European runner-up Evgeny Kuznetsov and Ilya Zakharov, who already claimed the podium's top spot five times (2011, 2012, 2013, 2014 and 2015). Germany's Patrick Hausding and Stephan Feck, who earned a fourth place at the 2016 Olympics, have not yet celebrated a European Championship title in this event. Their last medal dates back to 2015, when they won bronze. Further medal contenders are Illya Kvasha and Oleg Kolodiy. Kvasha was quite successful in the past, with Oleksiy Prygorov he won



the title in 2009 and 2010 as well as a bronze medal in 2012, with Oleksandr Gorshkovofov he earned silver in 2015 and bronze in 2014 and 2016. The duo of Kolodyi and Gorshkovofov took bronze in 2013.

1m Springboard Women

Since the 2009 championships in Turin it was always Tania Cagnotto of Italy who earned the podium's top spot in this event – with just one exception in 2012, when the winner was Anna Lindberg from Sweden. Last year, however, Cagnotto's compatriot Elena Bertocchi was hot on her heels, claiming the silver medal. Even though Bertocchi hopes to take the throne in Kiev, she will have to fight against Nadezhda Bazhina, bronze medallist in London, as well as local hero Anna Pysmenska.

Synchronised 3m Women

Due to the fact that eight-time winners Tania Cagnotto and Francesca Dallapè have ended their active careers, new champions will be crowned in Kiev for the first time since 2008. Among the top favourites are 2016 bronze medallists Nadezhda Bazhina and Kristina Ilinykh or Great Britain's Grace Reid and Katherine Torrance, 2016 junior World champion in the 1m springboard event. The two replace Alicia Blagg and Rebecca Gallantree who earned the silver medal in London last year. After Germany's Nora Subschinski (silver in 2014 and 2015) has ended her career, Tina Punzel will be competing with her new partner Friederike Freyer. The same applies for Viktoriya Kesar, who will start together with Anna Pysmenska instead of Anastasia Nedobiga. Defending champion Italy has not filed any entry this time.

10m Platform Men

Last year in London, Russia's Victor Minibaev and Nikita Shleikher claimed the silver and bronze medal respectively behind Tom Daley of Great Britain. Additionally, Minibaev took the title in the platform event in 2014. Minibaev as well as his compatriot Roman Izmailov is one of the top contenders in Kiev even though Vadim Kaptur (Belarus, bronze medallist in 2015) and Ukraine's Maksym Dolgov (without a medal so far in this event) hope to thwart their plans for a top spot on the podium.
